What are SATs?

- Children are assessed in;
Reading
Spelling
Punctuation
Mathematics.
- In KS1 the emphasis is on teacher assessment, the tests support this judgement.



Tasks and Tests

Assessment Area	
Reading	<p>2 papers consisting of fiction, non-fiction and poetry. 1st paper of 700 words, 2nd paper of 1100 words.</p> <p>Pupils read texts and answer a variety of questions. No time limit.</p>
Spelling	<p>Words read out by teacher, children to write them, (approx. 10 min)</p>
Punctuation	<p>A mixture of multiple choice and written questions, (approx. 20 min)</p>
Maths	<p>1st paper will cover general number skills such as addition, division and multiplication, (approx. 15 min)</p> <p>2nd paper will cover measurement, shape, money, time and interpreting charts, (approx. 35 min)</p>




Teacher Assessment

- Teacher assessment is used to support an overall judgement.
- Other subjects such as science will be assessed based on children's work throughout the year.
- All papers will be marked by the class teachers.
- Children will not be under test conditions, they will be done as subtly as possible.



The Results

- Results are not formally reported but are used by the school to ensure children are set appropriate work in Year 3.
- The pupils final end of key stage level will be given in the end of year reports.



What can you do to help?

- Read together **every day** and **ask questions** about the story
- Use number problems in every day life, at the shops, on the bus, telling the time etc.
- Continue to work on targets discussed at parents evening.
- Explicit revision is not necessary as children are already familiar with question format through use of old papers within lessons.
